As Deputy Commander of Cadets, Captain Eaton stewards the Civil Air Patrol (CAP) Cadet Program goals to motivate and develop well-rounded youth who will become model citizens and the future leaders of the nation. Cadets age 12 to 21 participated in leadership, physical fitness training, morale, ethical and aerospace education. Aviation orientation flights are offered aboard the Schweizer 2-33 glider and the Cessna-172 aircrafts.
